



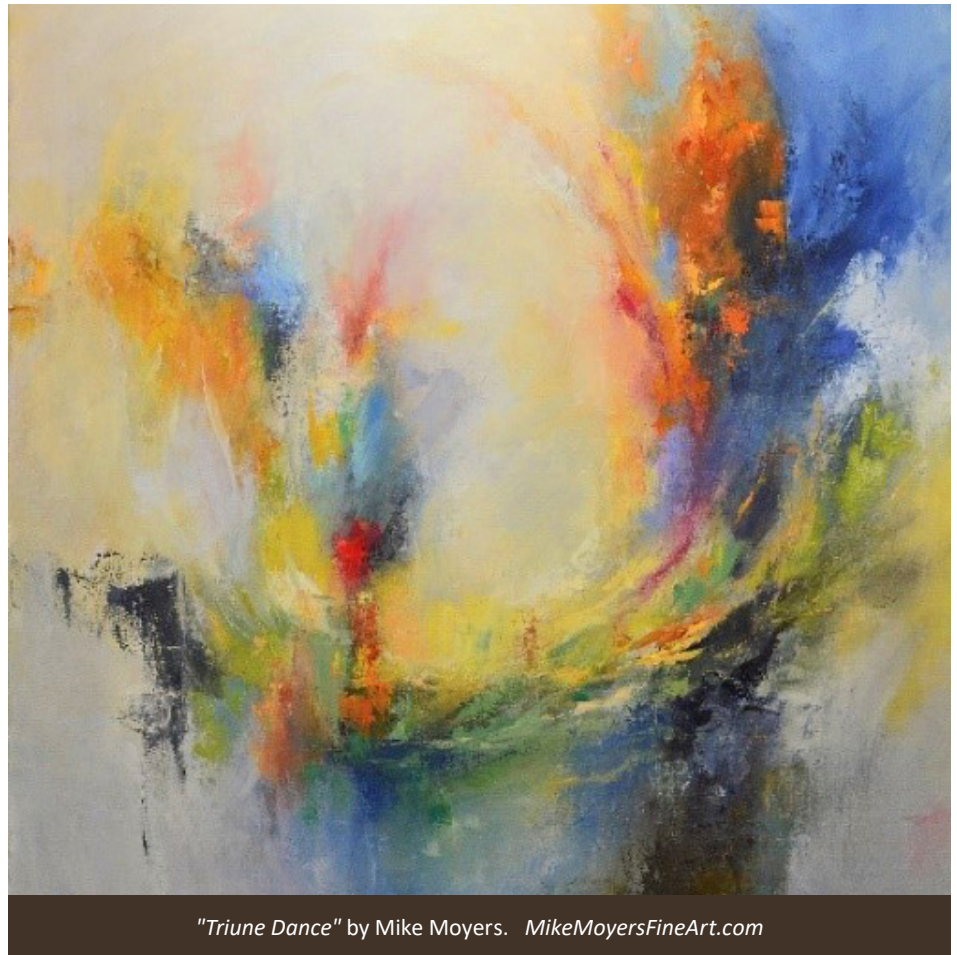
A New Springtime: The SSND Charism Growing Within

I don't believe you should ever settle into any role, there is always room to grow. I attended the New Employee Orientation in May 2021. Since that time, I have viewed my role at Notre Dame Learning Center in that larger context. I realized part of my responsibility is to convey and actively promote the SSND mission. After seeing faces and hearing voices connected to the other ministries, I was able to see

and feel a connection to the larger community. This is the essence of "making one".

Whenever possible, we try to share the five commitments in our program. We use water as an ongoing theme with our children through books and activities. Our center serves the students most affected by racism. Students in the Rochester City School district are primarily children of color. They recurrently experience violence and poverty – byproducts of systemic racism. Our program sets an example for our students that everyone deserves to be treated and given an opportunity. On a personal level, I volunteer for a non-profit that focuses on human trafficking victims and challenge myself to learn more about the sustainable development in Haiti and justice for immigrants.

The SSND continue to do good work in so many ways. The lives they touch through their ministries

is a sign that the congregation is not "settling" into their role either. Change is constant. Adaptation is necessary. Sometimes when one tree is cut down, we only see the bareness of the space. God takes that space and allows light and change to come in. There is an opportunity for growth in that newly created space. I see that growth and opportunity in the ministries of SSND. I am proud to be part of the SSND family.
