Human Trafficking and Forced Migration

January 23, 2024 at 7:00 pm, Virtual Gathering

January is Human Trafficking Awareness month in the USA.

One of the factors making people vulnerable to human trafficking is forced migration.

In 2023, the Alliance to End Human Trafficking (AEHT) (formerly US Catholic Sisters Against Human Trafficking) and the National Advocacy Center (NAC) of the Sisters of the Good Shepherd began an 18-month commitment to explore this connection and do something about it.

In 2023, they hosted a webinar. Speakers included a survivor of human trafficking and women religious who accompany migrants facing dangers posed by human traffickers. The AMSSND Ending Human Trafficking (EHT) and Justice for Immigrants (JFI) Committees are building on this webinar.
